NFL Overs & Unders - A Total-ly Different Perspective - Part 1

For nearly 4 decades wagering on the total points scored in NFL games has increased greatly in popularity. Totals allow the handicapper to concentrate on the flow or pace of a game rather than which team will have greater success. Obviously there is much overlap between the quality of the teams involved and the total points that will be scored but by looking at a game from an Over/Under perspective several weaknesses in the Totals line can be exploited. Of paramount importance is a knowledge of 'key' numbers for Totals much as 'key' numbers are important from a regular pointspread perspective.

In prior seasons our analysis covered all seasons beginning with 1981 such that in 2018 we looked at the 8,872 games played in the 37 seasons from 1981 through 2017. Much has changed over that time and for the sake of being a bit more current/relevant it's been decided to update our parameters to go back to 2002 when the most recent fundamental change in the structure of the NFL occurred – the introduction of 8 Divisions of 4 teams each. Between 2002 and 2022, a total of 21 seasons, there have been 5,407 regular season games played, a decently sized data base.

Here's a look at the key numbers for total points scored in those 5,407 NFL regular season games played between 2002 and 2022.

The first part of the Chart shows the ten most common total points results over the past 21 seasons and the percentage of the time that each has occurred. For example, 44 total points is the most common result and it has occurred 4.07% of the time, basically 1 game in 25. The 10 most common results have accounted for 33.75% of all results. In other words, slightly more than 1 game in 3 has fallen on one of these 10 'key' numbers.

The right hand part of the Chart looks at how frequently the total points in a game falls within one of five ranges. Ignoring the impact of Byes which now ads effectively and additional week to the season by spreading 17 games per team over 18 weeks, 1 or 2 games per "full" week of 16 games has featured total points of 21 or less while about 4 or 5 games each 'full' week has seen 52 or more points scored.

An average of 44.4 points per game have been scored over the 21 seasons with a range of a low of 41.2 ppg in 2005 to a high of 49.6 ppg in the Covid season of 2020. Because that was an unusual season in a number of respects the second highest average occurred in 2013, 46.8 ppg. Scoring's been relatively high compared to the 21 season average over the past decade with the 43.4 average ppg scored in 2017 the lowest average ppg since 2009. Thus far through the first 11 weeks of 2023 (164 games) averages points per game is 43.4 and there have been 64 OVERS, 99 UNDERs and 1 PUSH (60.7 % UNDERs, ignoring the line PUSH).

Next week we will present some interesting data which will show why wagering on Overs and Unders presents some very good opportunities based partly on the above data and also on how the linesmaker is restricted

in setting lines for Totals.

The regular college football season ends this Saturday for all teams except for Army and Navy (who will play their traditional season ending game in 2 weeks, on December 9). Many of this week's games will also be season ending traditional rivalry games with Bowl bids, rankings or just plain bragging rights for the next year at stake.

130 of the 133 FBS teams will be in action between Tuesday and Saturday. Louisiana Tech and USC have already finished their regular seasons and Army has a Bye until the game vs Army.

Next week will feature 10 FBS Conference Championship games.

7 FBS teams entered last week but with James Madison losing at home to Appalachian State just 6 teams remain hoping to conclude perfect regular seasons heading into their Conference Championship games. Only of the teams is guaranteed to complete that task as, for a second straight season, as both Michigan and Ohio State are 11-0 entering their showdown in Ann Arbor on Saturday. Hoping to join the winner of that battle as unbeaten are Florida State, Georgia, Liberty and Washington. Each is 11-0. Florida State visits rival Florida and both teams lost their starting QB last week. Liberty visits UTEP. Washington hosts Washington State in their annual Apple Cup showdown. But perhaps the biggest story is Georgia. The Bulldogs are at Georgia Tech, seeking to win their 28th straight game and complete a second consecutive unbeaten regular season. A win would also make Georgia 45-1 SU since the middle of the 2020 Covid season!

The FCS Playoffs begin this weekend with just 1 team finishing with a perfect 11-0 regular season and that's none other than defending FCS Champion South Dakota State. Only Montana managed to lose just once as the Bobcats went 10-1. Furman had a chance to also finish 10-1 but were upset last week as 20 point favorites on the road at Wofford, 19-13. That trio are among the 8 seeded teams that have Byes this week as the field of 24 is trimmed to 16 with 8 first round games this Saturday.

COLLEGE SELECTION OF THE WEEK: UNLV - 2 ½ over San Jose State - Both teams are well coached and each will be looked upon as a Bowl 'play on' team next month, UNLV has played consistently well all season, even with a solid second half in their September loss at Michigan. They have been able to play with the lead and rally from behind. Their ability to overcome in game adversity time after time is a sign of maturity and confidence, especially with a back up QB in control. UNLV coach Odom is experienced from his time in the SEC and will be highly sought after this off season. Much of the success has been credited to a potent offense. They've topped 30 points in 8 of 11 games. But the defense is much improved over past seasons. San Jose is also well tested albeit in one sided losses at USC and to Oregon State to open the season. Both have played well down the stretch. Against 4 common foes both are 3-1 and the stats in those common games are similar. San Jose State has fared better overall over the past half decade, even winning the MWC Title game in the Covid shortened 2020 season and made it to a Bowl game last season. UNLV has been woeful over the past decade. Their 5-7 record in 2022 was their best since doing the same in 2017 and their best since going 7-6 in 2013. A coaching change was made after last season despite that showing signs of improvement – an improvement that was greatly accelerated this season. Already assured of their best season in decades and with a chance to win the regular season MWC title outright and host next week's Conference Championship game on this very same field the short price is worth laying with a team playing fundamentally sound football with confidence but not cockiness. In a very well played game UNLV wins 31-23.

Other Featured College Selections

Ohio State + 3 ½ over MICHIGAN - Sometimes we get lucky and things go as we'd hoped and expected and such is the case here. For a second straight season Ohio State and Michigan are each unbeaten at 11-0 as they play to determine who will face lowa next week for the Big 10 Title. Either the Buckeyes or Wolverines will be solid double digit favorites to win and will likely be the #2 seed in the College Football Playoffs behind likely top seeded Georgia assuming the Bulldogs get by Alabama in the SEC Title game (and do not fall to Georgia Tech this weekend). What makes this matchup even more tasty is that both teams rank so highly in most categories, especially on defense (excluding games vs FCS teams). #3 and #1 in total defense. #1 and #2 in scoring defense (allowing under 10 points per game). Tied for #1 in pass defense. It's easy to make the case for either team. Our preference is to with the road underdog Buckeyes who seed revenge for back to back losses to their most bitter rival after winning 8 straight and 15 of 16 vs Michigan. The absence of Michigan coach Harbaugh on the sidelines is a negative for the hosts although his players will do their best to rally for him. Ohio State has played the tougher schedule. Although both teams defeated Penn State (the only 2 losses suffered by the Nittany Lions) Ohio State also bested Notre Dame. Michigan played no such powerhouse in non-conference play. Interestingly Michigan allowed its most points this season in their last 3 games (13, 15 and 24 in last week's tougher than expected tussle at Maryland). Interestingly those 3 games followed the reports of stealing signals of opponents. Ohio State, though occasionally starting slow in games,

played dominant football in second halves – a sign of great conditioning and focus. Ohio State wins 24-20.

Clemson - 7 over SOUTH CAROLINA — This is a revenge game for Clemson whose 7 game series winning streak ended last season with a 31-30 home loss to the Gamecocks. As noted last week (when we picked against Clemson and lost) at 7-4 this will be the Tigers' worst season in over a decade. And a second straight loss to their in-state rival could hurt recruiting between the programs which Clemson has long dominated. A 3 game winning streak does bring momentum into this game although 'Carolina also enters on a 3 game win streak and, at 5-6, needs a win to become Bowl eligible. Clemson's defense remains a strength as they are among the nation's best in forcing turnovers (2.1 per games, #5) and they have a top 10 pass defense to attack Carolina's unbalanced offense that relies much more heavily on the pass (#26) than the run (#129). The best win either team has this season is Clemson's home win earlier this month over Notre Dame which began their current win streak. Only their season opening loss to Duke was by more than one score (Duke's season went downhill when QB Leonard was injured in October). Of South Carolina's 6 losses, 5 were by double digits (all on the road). Carolina does benefit by playing a fourth straight home game and will be highly motivate to get the win for Bowl eligibility. But most of the fundamental edges are with the Clemson, especially on defense. Add in revenge, strong coaching and series history a solid case is make. Clemson wins 34-17.

LSU - 11 over Texas A&M — Expectations were high for both teams at season's start and whereas neither team was able to successfully navigate the season as desired one of these teams has had what would be considered by most programs to have had a successful season. This is LSU coach Kelly's second season since coming over from Notre Dame. At 8-3 LSU might be the best 8-3 team of all time. Behind Heisman Trophy candidate QB Daniels the Tigers have the nation's #1 offense, averaging 556 ypg vs fellow FBS teams, also leading the nation in scoring (44.3 ppg), avoiding turnovers and a balanced offense averaging 210 rushing ypg (#9) and 346 passing ypg (#3). The defense ranks poorly not due to player ability but to as a result of a potent, quick scoring offense that puts opponents in catch up mode early. LSU's losses were to 11-0 Florida State, 10-1 Alabama and to 9-2 Ole Miss. Under recently fired coach Fisher A&M never reached the heights expected when he was hired following the 2017 season. The Aggies have played strong defense but the offense was inconsistent and unable to make key plays in their biggest games. For Daniels to with the Heisman is a big deal for LSU, following the Trophy won by current Bengals QB Burrow in 2019. LSU will be highly energized for this game despite the early 11 AM local start time. Expect a big effort all around that includes the defense against and A&M team looking to begin another rebuild. LSU wins big, 44-23.

NFL SELECTION OF THE WEEK: TENNESSEE - 3 ½ over Carolina — This game has been on our radar since the Titans last played at home, a 28-23 win in QB Levis' first NFL start. He returns for his second home start following 3 straight road games in which he experienced the usual inconsistencies of a young QB who's still finding his comfort level. This has been a disaster of a season for Carolina as the Panthers have seen rookie QB (and #1 draft pick) Young amid criticism that they should have picked Stroud who's on his was to Rookie of the Year honors with Houston. Tennessee coach Vrabel is feeling some heat after losing the final 7 games of last season following a 7-3 start. At 3-7 that's 14 losses in the last 17 games. Spending all that time on the road (it's just the Titans second home game since October 1 hasn't helped. The Titans play 5 of their final 7 games at home and they will show improvement over the balance of the season even though hey will miss the Playoffs for a second straight season. Levis has shown the poise and potential to be a capable starting QB and don't be surprised if he starts a strong stretch of good play here. Tennessee wins 23-13.

Other Featured NFL Selections:

DALLAS - 11 over Washington (Thursday) — Dallas hosts Division rival Washington in its annual Turkey Day home game and the Cowboys have been rude hosts at home as they play just their fifth home game this season. Dallas has blown out their 4 previous guests by margins of 20 (vs Jets), 35 (Patriots), 23 (Rams) and Giants (32). The 4-7 Commanders are essentially in that same class of opponent as they face on the NFL's best balanced teams that ranks in the Top 10 in most offensive and defensive categories. All 3 losses were on the road — at the Cardinals, 49ers and Eagles and of the three only the first is a head scratcher. Note that each of those losses were on grass fields. Most of the matchups greatly favor Dallas, including their #5 pass offense against Washington's #30 pass defense. Dallas also excels in avoiding turning over the football while the Commanders average losing 1.9 giveaways per game. Washington QB Howell has not handled pressure well, having been sacked 51 times already. This is the first of 2 meetings this season which usually give an edge to the more talented team. And Dallas already has most of the edges. Dallas wins 37-13.

<u>Jacksonville - 1½ over HOUSTON</u> – With the continued development of rookie QB Stroud and improvement overall on both sides of the football Houston has put itself in Playoff contention. At 6-5 the Texans are just a game behind the Jaguars for the AFC South lead and go for a series sweep. Houston has gone 10-1 SU (8-3 ATS) vs the Jags since 2018 including 9 straight wins before losing on this field last season. The Texans won at Jacksonville back in September 37-17. Since that loss the Jags are 6-1 that included 5 straight wins before a home loss to the 48ers two weeks ago. Jacksonville entered the season as the Division favorite but

Houston has progressed much quicker than expected, led by their rookie QB. The Jags lead the NFL with 20 takeaways. The defenses are statistically even with both excelling against the run but below average vs the pass. This has become a crucial game for the Jags as they look to extend their Division lead to 2 games with tough games up next (vs Cincy, at Cleveland, vs Baltimore). A key might be Jacksonville excelling on defense on third down (33.8%, #3). The well coached Jags defeat the up and coming Texans, 27-20.

NY Giants + 3 over New England – The decline that began with the departure of QB Brady has accelerated for the Patriots who stand 2-8 following seasons of 7-9, 10-7 and 8-9 since Brady left after the 2019 season. The Pats thought they had a suitable replacement with Jones but he's regressed since his fine rookie 2021 debut season. Both teams have QB issues but the Giants are down to a third string untested QB due rather to injuries than to performance. The Giants have a pair of ugly one sided losses to Dallas but also a pair or wins over Washington. The Commanders are close to the Patriots in terms of talent and the Pats were also crushed by the Cowboys by 35. And the Pats lost at home to Washington, 20-17 and were outgained by 105 yards. New England is off their Bye but there's still little reason for them to be favored on the road. Oddly, their best effort this season was a 29-25 home win over Buffalo a month ago. But this has been Buffalo's poorest season to date since 2018 so that win can be somewhat discounted. Patriots coach Belichick has been subject to much criticism as to personnel and other decisions and seems to have lost the energy and intensity that marked his performance with Brady. Since Brady departed the Pats have shown less rebuilding and more of a steady regression. Getting points with a home dog in a match of seemingly evenly matched teams presents a good recipe for an upset. And the Giants at least enter with momentum. Giants win 20-16.
